Are you aware of the socialization needs of an Aussie puppy and do you feel you are capable of providing for these needs?

If you answered "No" to the last question, how to you intend to exercise and provide security for this puppy?

How large and of what type is the enclosure?

Do you let your dogs run loose and under what circumstances?

Have you ever used a crate to confine your dog? (By the way we do not think this is a bad thing, our dogs love their crates the odd time they go in them!)

Are you willing to have the the puppy's eyes checked on a yearly basis?

If you will be doing agility are you willing to have the puppy's hips x-rayed or OFA'd before starting to compete in agility?

If your plans are to one day breed your puppy, are you willing to have the puppy's hips x-rayed and submitted to either PennHip or OFA after the puppy is 24 months of age and before they are bred?

What area(s) of interest do you plan to pursue with your Aussie? Working stock, conformation, obedience, agility, pet/companion, gift, watch dog, breeding, 4-H project, trick dog (please list or circle all that apply)

If you plan to work your Aussie, what type(s) of livestock will be used?

Have you ever trained a dog for livestock before?

Have you ever worked or handled a dog on livestock before?

What sort of working drive do you feel would mesh with your personality, i.e. hard, sharp, moderate, low...and why?

Have you ever shown in: conformation? obedience? herding? agility?

If yes, where and to what extent?

If you are interested in breeding this dog, what are your reasons for breeding?

Are you willing to enrol the puppy in at least one structured obedience class?

Colour - please indicate your preference(s) Red Tri, Red Merle, Black Tri, Blue Merle

Do you prefer your dog to be male or female?

Would you consider an older or rescue dog?

If so, what is the maximum age you would accept

Are you willing to travel to New Mexico to meet the dam and sire of our puppies?

If travel is impossible (and we do understand that it is in some cases) would you be willing to allow a home visit from one of our friends in your area?

Please give us two references (name and phone number) of people that know or have known you and your dogs/pets.

Please give us the name and number of the local agency in your area that handles dog complaints.

Registration applications for all Australian Shepherds placed as pets will be marked as "non-breeding". Do you have any reservations about this policy?

If yes, please tell us about your reservations

Are you aware of some of the health problem which can appear in some Aussies today such as medication sensitivities?

Are you aware that Australian Shepherds are medium sized and very active dogs that shed (sometimes quite profusely)?

Are you willing to deal with these attributes that are so much a part of an Aussie?

The idea behind these questions is that, knowing the pups temperament from day one, we may see different things in them than you would as a stranger attempting to pick one. In this way we may be better able to guide you toward a puppy which realistically suits your experience, needs and goals.

We make every effort to ensure that our puppies are free from any inherited defects, by screening our breeding stock for those problems common to our breed. However, due to complex genetic interactions and environmental factors beyond our control, we cannot guarantee that a puppy purchased from us will be completely free of genetic disorders. If, at any time, your Aussie is diagnosed with any health problems, genetic or otherwise, we must be notified immediately of the full details so that we can make every effort to help with the situation. Our puppies are sold with a complete guarantee against monorchidism, cryptorchidism, Hip Dysplasia, Iris Coloboma, Cataracts or CEA (Collie Eye Anomaly).
